School Updates – Sept to October:

- Started with 155 students on opening day
- We had 35 move-ins and 29 move-outs so far
- Currently at 161 as of today.
- We are hiring a temporary EA for the year (we had one move to MUCC last year, and lost two students, but have now gained more students)
- Maude Burke School is pleased to share that a \$20,000 one-time grant from the Government of Saskatchewan's Teacher Innovation and Support Fund. The grant has been secured to support the Sensory Space Upgrade Project—an initiative designed to enhance student wellness, learning readiness, and inclusion across Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 6.
- We had a presentation by Professor Wow on Science with a circus twist, a
 Cyber presentation by Youth matters, Pictures and Retakes by Lifetouch and
 have signed on with them again next year. Gr. 4 attended Burger and Fries at
 Gateway vet.

- Pancake breakfast saw 250 people in attendance, Our student led conferences saw 83% attendance (up from last year with our one early on late vs two late nights), 82 adults attended our Halloween parade
- Teacher's have had a focus on self regulation strategies and identification to support new and existing students and we see continued success.
- Teachers attended convention on the 27th topics from Self Reg, to Reconciliation.
- In addition we have had staff attend training in Professional Assault Response Training, a safety program for workers who interact with potentially aggressive individuals, Math PD, ELA PD and math Thinking Classroom PD
- Mondays, our students are excited to take part in Come Read With Me, led by Ashley Toews and a group of volunteers.
- Staff did an assessment booster after school and worked on Success Criteria and Learning Intentions to support students.
- Last but not least, we had our Remembrance Day Assembly on the 7th and had 9 Legion Members present.
