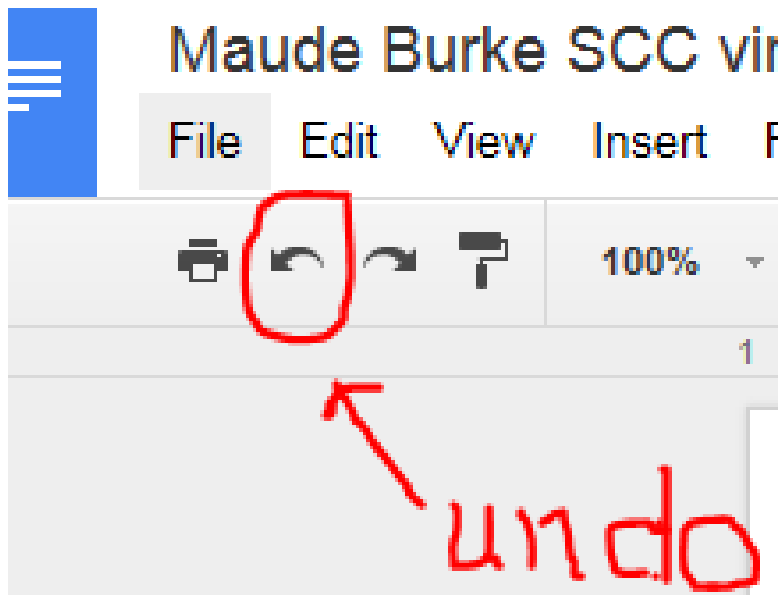


Welcome and Thank You for taking part in our virtual SSC meeting -

2) New Items:

A. *Principal's report:*

a. **Grade 6 Floorhockey:** Brunswick and Burke will host a girls and boys floorhockey tournament March 22 pm - we no longer compete school vs school but rather mix the teams to give students the opportunity to meet other students in a structured setting for transition support to MUCC grade 7 next year.

Is the tournament during school hours? Erin Yes, it's in the afternoon. (Jill) - boys at Burke, girls at Brunswick.(RS)

- b. **All About Me/Tell Them From Me** - Students in grades 4-6 have or will be working on a provincial survey regarding various aspects from academics, rigor of work, advocates at home/school, bullying, extra curricular, cel phone use, etc. This information provides the school with information to support our future planning. We have taken part in this survey now for approx 4-5 years.
- c. **Diagnostic Leveled Reading (DLR)** - Teachers in grades 1-3 will submit DLR levels March 22nd to the division. We have a bulletin board in our front entrance regarding reading levels and levels students should be at...if you have not looked at it, please take a peek! Our goal is by grade 3 June to have 80% of students at or above grade level. Reading is one of the most important aspects of school success....be sure to read to and have your children read to themselves and you every day!
- d. **Archery** - over 800 archers are registered for the March 30 and 31st Saskatchewan Provincial Tournament. The Maude Burke Archers compete March 30th at 9 and 10 am. We will be having a school pep rally, parents welcome on March 28th at 2:40pm - wear black and blue for archery spirit day!

C. AED fundraiser: The school is going to be doing fundraising over this and next school year to purchase an AED machine. After book fair and Telemiracle which have taken a great deal of monies out of our community, we have put this on hold for a little bit. I believe the **Erin** has some exciting news from RBC for us though.

- This link below may now be irrelevant...Erin has an update of some monies, and I have \$2099 that I am able to utilize from our School based funds - money that is accumulated from items such as when we get Lifetouch pictures, we get a % back to the school, etc. We have let this accumulate and now have that amount that we are able to put towards the AED. projects!! With the money that you have Randy, we should be really close for an AED. I would still like to do the fundraiser of the activity carnival. Maybe a really fun event once we can go outside....May or June or should it be something we plan for September?? Erin

D. Playground - when the time comes that our equipment is deemed needed to be replaced, there is a process in place that requires budgeting, pricing, planning, etc. We are not at a point where it requires immediate replacement. There is also an option to start adding small structures, but again, a budget fundraising goal needs to be set up with the division. Any grants we apply for we need approval for from the Chief Financial Officer of the NESD.

a. We may want to start thinking about large scale ideas, as most likely in the next 5 years we will need to proceed in some fashion. Candace found a Canada Post grant.

When it becomes time to replace the playground equipment, do we have notice or once the equipment isn't safe is it removed and done? Erin (We will be given a timeline on when it needs to be replaced..example..in 3 years this needs to be removed RS)

I'd like to be involved in the fundraising/budgeting process of the new playground structure when it comes time to start planning for this. A few ideas that I'd like to put forward for future discussion are:
