### **2. Principal's Update** – Jill read on behalf of Randy. Big jump in Grade 3 reading levels from November to March. Able to do more with Alison Beecher as the Literacy Coach. (refer to the chart on page 2)

In Math – smaller targets have been set as opposed to setting larger goals for the kids to reach. (refer to the chart on page 2)

Feed All Four – There was quite a large jump in regards to anxiety. (refer to the chart on page 3) What are the needs, what can we do to meet them better. Globalization and Social Media now play a huge part in kids' lives. Teach the kids that "It's hard but you can handle it", teach them resilience's and different abilities to cope with different issues.

Jill spoke about the "Big Life Journal" Includes topics like, Dreaming Big, Being Persistent, Be Mindful etc. Lots of useful material, 200 plus pages. Perhaps we can use some of the materials? Journaling – different ways to get feelings out. Lots of parent help sheets are in the material. Should we have someone come in and speak about Growth Mindset? Make a plan to use the \$1300 for a parent engagement program next school year. Jill also discussed a t-shirt program that Battleford is doing and it bring Seniors and Students together. T-shirts are \$22/each but a school price of \$16/each. Something for the grades to take part in? This would have to be a fundraiser as opposed to something parent engagement related.

### **3. Old Business** – Staff were sent a video on the use of the AED Machine. Erin asked if there was other things that go hand in hand with the AED, such as pockets masks, gloves, and triangle bandages etc.

Snack and Breakfast Program – We are good for this year, and continue at 5 days a week. Not sure of what is coming our way for fall funding as we won't know until we get the grant.
