
Maude Burke SCC virtual meeting - March 12-16, 2018

This trip costs us roughly \$2500 for one day for the approx 40 students in grades 5 and 6 that take part. It is a great outing, but the cost is very extensive. As it is during the school day, the monies need to come from school budget. We are reviewing the need for this monies and possible use in other areas as our school ages and desks, chairs, projectors etc start to wear out and age. Our finalized field trip outline will be shared with SCC soon. Just a suggestion for future consideration and to keep costs minimal - would it be feasible to plan a snowshoeing field trip out to the DNR campground (sorry if this

- c. Staffing Updates at this time, we are working on staffing projections for the upcoming year. If you or anyone you know is moving out of our area, or into our area, please contact, or have them contact the office asap. In addition, if you have a Kinder student for next year, please stop by and fill out a registration form. We will be having a kinder meet and greet in May.
- i.Welcome to new Staff Member Miss Cassandra Lechler. Miss Lechler will be taking over from Mrs. Hoenmans who is leaving on maternity leave March 26th. We wish Mrs. Hoenmans all the best and look forward to working with Miss Lechler!
 - d. School supplies we will continue to utilize School Start supplies one as we have had positive feedback from parents who have used the program. Three years ago, it was a discussion item at the staff and SCC level, but we opted to proceed with the idea via local vendors. For the last two years, we offered School start online ordering from this Alberta based company.
- i.at the start of the school year, they send to the school all of the orders done by parents over the summer parents then do not have to go shopping for supplies, and there is supposed to be a bulk purchase discount, followed by 8% of sales that goes back to the school that we can use towards snack or other. The company provides 40 labels with student name. We can have a delivery date of a week prior to school we can then set items up at the school, parents can come and pick them up and put labels on, then send the bag back to school and you are done!
 - 1. This process will allow the school to see the price of the list. As a principal, with two kids, I know that school supplies, new shoes, new school clothes, etc. is an extremely expensive time. Working with www.schoolstart.ca will allow each us to see how much \$\$ it costs for the supplies we are asking you to provide. This may be a good visual to allow the teacher to remove items that are not used much, or reduce number of items being asked for....it is easy to pick something up later that a child runs out of I do not think we need everything on day one of school...which can hopefully help us reduce the initial return to school expense. This is optional...parents can still go to the store and purchase supplies as well.

e. Swimming:

- For Kinder where we have parents in the change rooms, and thus we request a criminal records clearance - thanks to our parents that have done this so far - we appreciate the time it takes to do this and to volunteer your time - but appreciate knowing our kids are safe and attended to!
- 2. With our reconstruction of our field trip structure for our school to ensure equity, experiences, learning opportunities and cost effective outings..we have been working as a staff and with Reynolds and Brunswick schools to create a new 5 year field trip structure for our school. We will update swim times for grades 1-6 when completed. We will be moving to non-winter swim times to prevent cold students on the bus as this has been an issue for us.

3. Kinder dates are shared with parents and also on our calendar. Kinder shares pool costs with Reynolds and Brunswick.

f.Student Led Conferences - April 24 and 25- evenings

- 1. 24th will be a celebration of learning information to be sent home soon this will be for all families on the first night.
- 2. 25th this will be a parent teacher student interview night as requested by parents or the teacher and will not include all families
- 3. Remember...anytime you are concerned about academics or personal and social development of your child book a meeting, phone, or email your teacher ASAP as we no longer do this at student conferences...the conferences are to celebrate learning. Teachers with concerns will also make contact with you, but feel free to do this at anytime.

G. Tell Them From Me Survey - This will take place again starting this week.

- i. This is a student and parent survey
- ii.Students in grades 4-6 will complete an online survey about their school this feedback is used at the staff level for data and decision making.
- **iii.**Since we are looking at possible playground upgrades in the near future, there is a question for these students on what they would like on the playground so we can start getting some feedback and ideas.

H. Enrolment

- Maude Burke has a very healthy enrolment number = we hover around the 210 mark
- We are excited about our upcoming addition of two classroom spaces
- This will see Pre K return to our school pushing us up to roughly 226 students for next year
- As we have our kinder meet and greet in May we will learn more about Kinder numbers - at this time we do not know if there will be one or two sections of K.
- The building tender should be out soon and we anticipate a fall or late fall opening for our new classrooms more information to follow.
- I would like to share a Pre K update that Mrs. Gendall shared last year to help people understand the Pre K process and rationale:
- Mrs Gendall shared this information:
 - o Pre-K is a program aimed at the most vulnerable 3-4 year old children in our school community. The program runs Monday-Friday mornings, and our focus is on building language, creating opportunities for socialization and problem solving, increasing motor skills development, and gaining a deeper understanding of our world. We have a maximum of 16 spots to fill, and currently we are full with a waitlist of four children. As students move away and spots open up throughout the year, students on the waitlist will be accepted. Applications are at the school office, and can be filled out at any time throughout the school year. We begin looking at applications for the following fall at around April. When our intake team meets to discuss potential applicants, we look for

specific criteria, such as (but not only) behaviour difficulties, language delays, concerns with development, or difficult family situations. Unfortunately, we receive a large number of applications, and are not able to accept every student who applies. If you have or know of a child who would benefit from the Pre-K program, I encourage you to come to the school office to fill out an application.

I. Outreach Update:

Nutrition: We continue to provide a Breakfast Program as needed and Universal Snack 3 days a week (M, W, F). This is going well and we are right on budget (with not much to spare!).

Events: We continue to do our Gr 4,5,6 after school program where we bring together the 3 schools once a month to help ease the transition to MUCC. This month is Yoga! Thanks to Indigo Yoga Co. for volunteering to lead this activity. If you have any special talents that you would be willing to share with our students by volunteering to lead an activity please let me know. :)

Donations: We are still in need of donations of gently used children's shoes to be used as indoor shoes - especially for the younger grades (K-3). B.Moskal Are you looking for spring coats as well? I have a few I can send over. Erin Erin, that would be greatly appreciated! Thanks!! Randy
