
### Maude Burke SCC virtual meeting - March 7-12 2017

### Christmas Craft Carnival -school's budget

**Grade 6 tournaments** – are designated only for grade 6 (soccer, volleyball and <u>floorhockey</u> as an athletic opportunity and opportunity for all grade 6 students from each school to get together and meet in an organized form prior to MUCC). These take place in an afternoon as a part of PE/health curriculum.

<u>Cross country</u> – is designated for those 9 years old and older as of the day of the run. This takes place at a noon hour.

Track and Field –Encourage all to participate, but will not make any child have to do an event. We encourage all students to even try each event once (ie. High jump) and then remove themselves. This is an all day event.

### e) Report Cards - April 13

(Easter Break - April 14th to 23) - return on the 24th (Blue Kinder day)

i) Student led conferences - April 25th will be a come and go celebration of learning in the classrooms (like we did last year at this time) vs. the sit down student conference (like you did in November of this school year)...making it

more flexible, less stressful for students and parents. Parents and students will

join and take part in activities the students are working on or have worked on in class...a time for the parent to do the work of the students, and a time for the students to share their abilities with you! This is intended to be fun and enjoyable!!

Remember...anytime you are concerned about academics or personal and social development of your child - book a meeting, phone, or email your teacher ASAP - as we no longer do this at student conferences...the conferences are to celebrate learning. Teachers with concerns will also make contact with you, but feel free to do this at anytime.

April 26th will be a time for an optional student led conference one on one with the teacher. The teacher may request your attendance, or you can request a time to meet with the teacher as well. If you would like to book a time for this, you can call Kendra at the school and book a time between 4 and 6 pm, Wed. March 26th.

ii)End of April, start of May - **testing** for RAD (Reading), and EYE - (Kinder development) will be taking place.

**iii) TTFM** - Tell them from me, gr 4,5,6 student feedback is taking place this year, between now and March 17th.

f) Pre - Kinder - Mrs. Gendall will be holding Pre-K at Reynolds school again. We anticipate 198 students k-6 at Burke school, thus need to run our Pre-K program from Reynolds. Mrs Gendall shared this information:

Pre-K is a program aimed at the most vulnerable 3-4 year old children in our school community. The program runs Monday-Friday mornings, and our focus is on building language, creating opportunities for socialization and problem solving, increasing motor skills development, and gaining a deeper understanding of our world. We have a maximum of 16 spots to fill, and currently we are full with a waitlist of four children. As students move away and spots open up throughout the year, students on the waitlist will be accepted. Applications are at the school office, and can be filled out at any time throughout the school year. We begin looking at applications for the following fall at around April. When our intake team meets to discuss potential applicants, we look for specific criteria, such as (but not only) behaviour difficulties, language delays, concerns with development, or difficult family situations. Unfortunately, we receive a large number of applications, and are not able to accept every student who applies. If you have or know of a child who would benefit from the Pre-K program, I encourage you to come to the school office to fill out an application.

Although we are running our Pre-K program from Reynolds School, we will continue to have students from the Maude Burke area together in the same class, to build friendships that will continue once they are in Kindergarten. I maintain close contact with the staff at Burke (specifically, the Kindergarten teacher, outreach worker, and DET) to ensure your child receives the best support in making the transition to Kindergarten at Maude Burke.

# g) . Outreach Update:

Brandi will update events to date, snack, breakfast, upcoming,

- a. After School Programs We continue to hold monthly (with some exceptions) After School Programs for Gr 4-6 where students participate in an organized activity with other students from all 3 local elementary schools. The goal of this program is to ensure smoother transition to MUCC through increased peer interactions. We recently went curling, are doing a Paint Nite theme this month and will be going bowling in April. In June we will hold our yearly Grade 6 MUCC scavenger hunt!! If you have students in these grades please encourage them to participate in these activities when possible.
- b. School Nutrition Budget We receive money from a variety of sources to support our Breakfast Program and our Universal Snack Program (ex. Division money, Co-Op donations, SaskTel donation, etc.) We rely on all these sources of funding to provide a daily snack to our students. Our SCC has also budgeted some money to be used to help support our nutrition programming if needed (Thanks!). I am predicting that we will need to start using this budgeted money over the next few months as our other funding sources are starting to run low. I would also like to take a moment to THANK our local Prairie North Co-Op for all that they do on a daily basis (food prep, daily delivery) for our school. I can honestly say that we would not be able to provide the quality of snack program that we do without them.
- c. Breakfast for Learning money This year we received a grant from Breakfast for Learning that helps support our Universal Snack Program. A portion of this money was awarded in the form of Loblaw gift cards that needed to be spent at Cindy's Independent Grocer. Unfortunately, Cindy's was not able to work with us like the Co-Op does. We were able though to get this money spent and used it to support our programs the best that we could. Thank you to Breakfast for Learning for this grant.
- d. Family Literacy Night We will be holding a "Super Hero" Family Literacy Night on Wednesday March 22 from 6:30-7:30pm. Students who attend MUST be accompanied by an adult. Families will have the opportunity to engage in literacy related activities for example, designing your own superhero, illustrating a comic strip, making a superhero mask and decorating (and eating!) a superhero cookie. Everyone is welcome. A note will be sent home with your child soon. Please RSVP if you plan on attending so that we can be prepared. Thank you to Post-Media Raise A Reader and our SCC for supporting this event. I hope to hold a second Family Literacy Night in May.
- h) **Volunteers** Thanks for the work the SCC has done to bring out new volunteer for the various events! A special thanks to all the volunteer support Maude Burke School gets we appreciate it!!! (Maude Burke Staff)
- i) **Enrolment -** our projected enrolment for next year looks like this:

- We have 9 instructional spaces in our building. This includes the old computer lab that is a little smaller than the regular classrooms and works well for a small sized class with smaller sized students
- The library this year has a ¾ split for the morning....we have 20 students and that is max that we can hold in that space if we have to utilize the space all day, then our library use is hindered
- High numbers are a good thing vs low numbers and not enough to make a school viable we will have to look at some splits and possibly some team teaching.
- The upcoming budget will be critical in determining some of our future and teacher -student ratios.
- We have no retirements on teaching staff this year.

Question: Curious if it has been decided if Kindergarten will be full days or half days next year? (Keith)

Thanks Keith - we have 19 confirmed students entering Kinder, and with projections based on birth data from this year entering, we are projecting up to 26 entering. If we have under 26 we will run one section, and it would be one day on and one day off. If we have 26 or over, if our budget allows (after March 22nd Prov announcement) we will run two sections...one on one day and one on the next. Half days create a bus situation for us, as we have to bus students at lunch back home...but also, a half day frees up a half day classroom for us. Nonetheless, we are anticipating that we will not have the budget monies nor the bus driver to be able to do an extra noon run, so you can assume a one day on and one day off schedule.

Just a tip for next year, when doing the kinder classes, if you have 2 classes please do a Mon/Wed and Tues/Thursday switching every other Friday. It is way easier for setting up a sitter. (Erin)

March 28th is the Kinder orientation day - Miss B has a great event lined up with a tour, snacks, some activities for the kids to complete, etc...this day will give us a better idea on numbers as well...hope you can join the group for a come and go orientation on that day. Kendra is sending home a package to families already registered regarding this date! Thanks! (Randy)

I am wondering if the 2 current kinder classes will be joining to one class?? Also, who the Grade one teacher is for next year?? (Erin)

- -Erin, we will not know class configuration until we know what our staffing allotment. Right now we are anticipating split grades in a number of areas next year such as ½ or ½ for some areas...but again will not know that until April/May.
- -In terms of teaching staff, Miss Lueken will be one grade 1 teacher, and we may have another 1 or ½ and will see if we have staff transfer, Miss Pederson return from maternity, or may be a hiring....this we do not know as of yet.
- -Erin, one more item...this year we went one day on, one day off for Kinder...so if you went Friday, no school due to a holiday Monday, you would know you do not go on Tuesday....you had shared another option for kinder -can you share what that was....and we may look at having some input from parents at kinder orientation on preference. Thanks (Randy)

The idea was a Mon\Wed and Tues\Thurs and switch every other Friday. It is much easier to have a consistent schedule for setting up days at the sitter. (Erin)

- e) SCC water bottle filling station this turned out fantastic and has seen very high use!!! To date, the counter on it states that we have saved 425 water bottles from our landfill station. Tammy may be able to share the exact price of the machine. The plumber charged us \$581. The electrician is being covered by maintenance as there was work done with the cement in the wall and some other electrical needs:)
