
Maude Burke SCC virtual meeting - March 7-12 2016

Grade 6 tournaments – are designated only for grade 6 (soccer, volleyball and <u>floorhockey</u> as an athletic opportunity and opportunity for all grade 6 students from each school to get together and meet in an organized form prior to MUCC). These take place in an afternoon as a part of PE/health curriculum.

<u>Cross country</u> – is designated for those 9 years old and older as of the day of the run. This takes place at a noon hour.

- e. **Student led conferences** we are looking at a change to an open house process celebrating learning in the classrooms vs. the sit down student conference...making in more flexible, less stressful for students and parents. Remember...anytime you are concerned about academics or personal and social development of your child book a meeting, phone, or email your teacher ASAP as we no longer do this at student conferences...the conferences were to celebrate learning. Teachers with concerns will also make contact with you, but feel free to do this at anytime. Again, we will share more on the April 26 or 27 Open House "Celebration of Learning" event soon.

Pre Kinder I will leave this spot here for Mrs. Gendall to share about Pre-K....what the program is, how many students we are allowed to have, how students get into the program, where you can get a form to fill out, are there spots that open up during the year, etc.....parents, feel free to ask additional questions as well that may not have been answered.

Pre-K is a program aimed at the most vulnerable 3-4 year old children in our school community. The program runs Monday-Friday afternoons, and our focus is on building language, creating opportunities for socialization and problem solving, increasing motor skills development, and gaining a deeper understanding of our world. We have a maximum of 16 spots to fill, and currently we are full with a waitlist of four children. As students move away and spots open up throughout the year, students on the waitlist will be accepted. Applications are at the school office, and can be filled out at any time throughout the school year. We begin looking at applications for the following fall at around April. When our intake team meets to discuss potential applicants, we look for specific criteria, such as (but not only) behaviour difficulties, language delays, concerns with development, or difficult family situations. Unfortunately, we receive a large number of applications, and are not able to accept every student who applies. If you have or know of a child who would benefit from the Pre-K program, I encourage you to come to the school office to fill out an application. (Jill)
