- 2) Principal's report:
 - a. School Goal Literacy related Goal to increase our DLR scores by March 2023. Reading Comprehension tip sheet sent home to families Jan 9th to promote a common language team approach. School activity to be planned to tie into reading comprehension with March 27-31st book fair Classrooms have reading comprehension bookmarks and are choosing a focus of the week with students.
 - March 31st Dress up as a detective! We have been working on inferencing with our students, school wide, to support our students' reading levels. On March 31st, we will have a division one and a division two school mystery contest taking place throughout the day!
 - b. **Student led conferences:** you can still sign up to the end of the day today on EDSBY..thanks to those who were able to sign up! On Monday and Tuesday, we will sign the remaining names to a time and send it home. Remember, this is in person, but if you would rather do a phone interview, let us know! - g. **OUR SCHOOL Tell Them From Me -** Students in grades 4-6 have will be working on a provincial survey regarding various aspects from academics, rigor of work, advocates at home/school, bullying, , cel phone use, etc. This

There was also discussion at the last meeting regarding a family picnic for noon buying. Miss Mann and Miss Beecher, do you have

thoughts on this...was it too many people in the library at once (do not want to make people late for work). We can also look at doing Div 1 one day and Div 2 the next day – how would that work for you as a parent if you have children in each end and you have to come two days in a row? Thoughts/feedback/other ideas? I believe we will also have after school buying time again.

I just met with Ms Mann and here are our feelings. We would rather not have a parent lunch during this week. Rationale for this is that the lunch hour buying times were extremely busy and we could not accommodate people in a timely manner. This resulted in us not being able to get back to our work duties when lunch was over. We would also be concerned that if we had a parent lunch, that families wouldn't come in to the library until 12:45 etc, putting us in an even bigger time crunch.

Instead, we would propose doing after school buying times for families on Tuesday and Wednesday 3:30-4:30, along with Friday afternoon 1:00- 2:30. Each class will also have their own designated buying time throughout the week. If none of these times work for a family, please reach out to Carla or I and we will make sure to find you a time slot that would work for you \bigcirc

Since we have been working on a reading comprehension goal as a whole school, we will send home an activity for parents to complete with their children. This can be returned to school to be entered into a draw for a \$25 gift certificate.
